

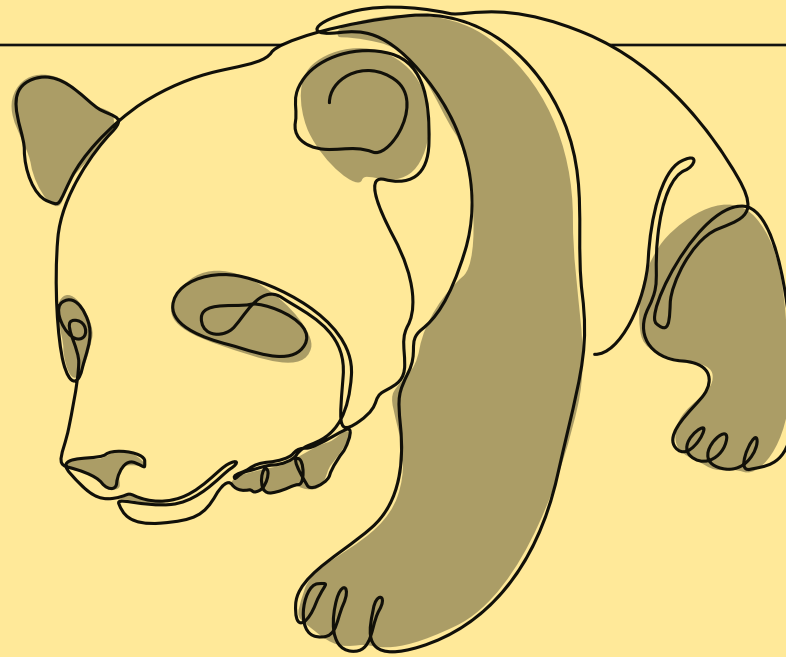

# Meek Manatees

(*Trichechus*)

**This primarily herbivorous marine mammal** is generally a solitary animal, spending about 50% of a day grazing in shallow, marshy coastal waters at depths of approximately 1–2 m (3–6 ft), and mostly sleeping the rest of the time.

They can grow up to 4 m (13 ft) long, weighing as much as 590 kg (1,300 lbs). Manatees will typically breed *only every two years*; bearing a single calf, and weaning takes 12 to 18 months.

Manatees are capable of understanding discrimination tasks showing signs of *complex associative learning* similar to Dolphins. Social interactions between manatees are complex, which may indicate a higher intelligence, but they remain poorly understood by science.

The main causes of manatee deaths are human-related issues, like encounters with man-made objects, habitat destruction, and climate change.

# Gregarious Geckos

(*Gekkonidae*)

**Found in warm climates on every continent**, except Antarctica, geckos range from 1.6–60 cm (0.6–23.6 in) in size and are a mostly carnivorous lizard. With 1,500 species worldwide, they are the most species-rich group of all lizards. Like other *ectothermic reptiles*, a gecko's body temperature is dependent on its environment.

Geckos are unique among lizards for their vocalisations. Their loud mating calls are well known, but they also use chirping or clicking sounds in their social interactions and are capable of making hissing noises when threatened.

Being primarily nocturnal, geckos have excellent night vision. Their color vision is 350 times more sensitive than human eyes in low light conditions. In addition, most gecko species lack eyelids; instead, their eyes have a transparent membrane, called the *brille*, which they often lick to keep them remaining clean and moist.
